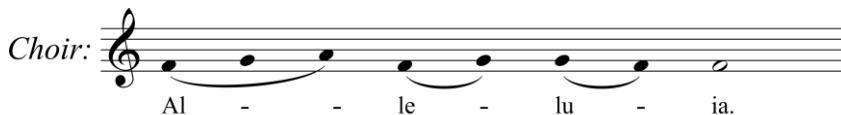

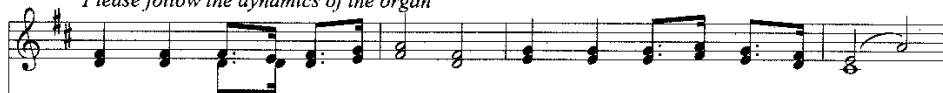

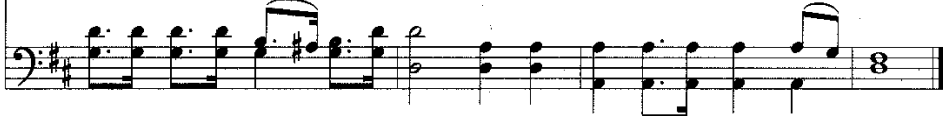

*MUSIC NOTES:* The Prelude to this service is by *Ernest Bloch (1880–1959)*, a Swiss-born American composer who had a distinguished academic career. Bloch was Jewish, and his *Six Preludes for Organ* were written for Jewish liturgical worship. These pieces are offered with special intention for the victims of violence at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh. • *Edgar Bainton (1880–1956)* was a student of Charles Villiers Stanford at the Royal College of Music. Bainton was not a prolific composer, and he is best remembered today for his anthem *And I saw a new heaven*. • Spanish composer *Tomás Luis de Victoria (1548–1611)* composed the All Saints Motet “*O quam gloriosum*” in 1572. A “parody” Mass, the movements of the *Missa “O quam gloriosum”* freely draw their inspiration from the interior of his Motet of the same name. • American organist *John Ferguson (b. 1941)* is well-known for his long association with St. Olaf College and Lutheran church music. His playful yet profound hymn arrangement “*Shall we gather at the river*” vividly depicts running water. • The concluding Voluntary paints a grand picture of “the eternal church” eventually building to full organ, and back down again. The piece is at once mystical, captivating, and transcendent. This single piece of music is the subject of a 2006 film of the same name.
