And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

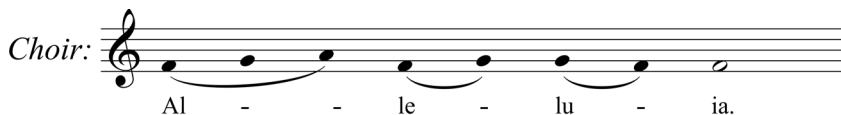

*MUSIC NOTES:* William Henry Harris (1883–1973) studied composition with Charles Wood and H. Walford Davies. Harris was the organist and choirmaster at St. George’s Chapel, Windsor and professor of organ and harmony at the Royal College of Music in 1934 when he wrote the hymn anthem *O what their joy and their glory must be* for that year’s Three Choirs Festival. A hymn anthem is an elaboration of a hymn text, usually set to a familiar melody, but sometimes set to one of the composer’s devising. It was an increasingly popular form of church music in the first part of the twentieth century. “O what their joy” is based on the text and tune pairing found at Hymn 623. It intersperses melodic material of Harris’s own creation with the familiar hymn tune “O quanta qualia.” Vaughan Williams’s “Lord, thou hast been our refuge” (last sung September 15) and Wood’s “God omnipotent reigneth” (last sung November 25, 2018) can also be classified as hymn anthems.
