

MUSIC NOTES: The hymn sung at Communion is written by our Bishop, The Right Reverend George Wayne Smith. The hymn tune, "Thaxted" is taken from The Planets by Gustav Holst (1874–1934) • American composer Randall Thompson (1899–1984) was asked to write a piece of music for the opening of the Berkshire Music Center (now known as Tanglewood) in Lennox, Mass. The work he composed, Alleluia, is an elaborate treatment of that single word with a concluding Amen sung by the sopranos, tenors, and basses. This well-loved choral work has an arch form: it is soft and subdued in its outer sections, but the intensity steadily builds toward climax marked by octave "fanfare" figures.

The altar flowers are given to the glory of God in honor of the marriage of Marghuretta Dakota Bland and Christopher O'Connor.
