The Lessons

Lector: A Reading from The Book of The Acts of the Apostles. (11: 1-18) *sit*

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, “Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?” Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, “I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, ‘Get up, Peter; kill and eat.’ But I replied, ‘By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.’ But a second time the voice answered from heaven, ‘What God has made clean, you must not call profane.’ This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man’s house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, ‘Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.’ And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, ‘John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.’ If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?” When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, “Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.”

MUSIC NOTES: The Anglican Chant for Psalm 148 is by *David Koehring (b. 1940)*, who was in the first class of fellows of the College of Church Musicians at Washington National Cathedral. The chant is a palindrome, being the same ten chords forwards as backwards. It is hoped that the significance of this music is not lost on those being confirmed and received by the bishop this morning, or those in the parish graduating from high school or college. Though this time of year is marked by various “commencements,” what might be perceived as an ending is really just the beginning. The anthem is by the London-born composer *Nicholas White (b. 1967)* who has been the the post of Director of Chapel Music & Organist at St. Paul’s School, Concord, New Hampshire since 2011. White’s *Anthems at the Mandatum* were written for the washing of the feet on Maundy Thursday, but this music is equally at home in this morning’s service alongside today’s Gospel lesson. • The French organist *Marcel Dupré (1886–1971)* was the titular organist of the church of St. Sulpice in Paris beginning in 1934, the year he succeeded *Charles-Marie Widor (1844–1973)* who had held the post since 1870.

Today's Visitation Offering is designated for *Deaconess Anne House*

“This intentional community for young adults was founded in 2012. It’s part of a church-wide network called the Episcopal Service Corps and it works from a house in Old North Saint Louis. The presence of this community has allowed our diocese to stake a new sort of claim for ministry in St. Louis City.

The footprint of Deaconess Anne House is far larger than the number of people who have lived there suggests. It extends into almost every corner of the diocese, and it has become a center for mission for many of our parishes.

In the months and years since Ferguson became a word loaded with meanings about the historic and current racisms here, the House became a rallying point for our Church’s response. Its gift for us became obvious.

Corps Members have been blessed to have a formation in life and faith that they would not have otherwise had. People who have lived in the House have discerned calls to all sorts of ministry, lay and ordained, both in this diocese and beyond. It is a ministry dynamo.

It is a pearl of great price, something costly, yes, but something to be cherished beyond expectations. Deaconess Anne House is a gift of the Spirit for us.”
